

C10 Revision Cycle – Approved by IKECA ANSI Consensus Body October 2013

American National Standards are kept current and relevant by means of timely revisions. “Periodic maintenance is defined as the maintenance of a standard by review of the entire document and action to revise or reaffirm it **on a schedule not to exceed five years** from the date of its approval as an American National Standard.” (ANSI Essential Requirements, 4.7.1)

The cleaning standard C10 was developed and is maintained by IKECA. ANSI approved C10 in December 2011. The standard was published in February 2012.
